
Executive Summary – part I



"On which maturity level do you currently see your compliance program in your company?" and "... in the future? What is the ambition?"






These 4 levels are according to a PwC publication "The Future of Compliance in the Pharmaceutical Industry".


Level 4.0 should be labeled as "Ethics & Responsivity driven"

1. Are you a member of any compliance or industry association(s)?






2. Did you attend already other multi company events / workshops dedicated to ESG matters?

- This event hit the "nail on the head"






- 'Aspects for a new role of Ethics and Compliance' were most favorable

What was the least useful / helpful / enjoyable element of this ESG workshop? – Q 7,8









Do deep dive on reporting and how to coordinate, maybe talk about tools and platforms.

- Great settings, in particular the short length of each session, max. 30 to 45 min

Deeper dive on select sections of ESG on which compliance function don't have better understanding.

Good length, nice place, enough interactions and flexibility (hours, break out sessions outside)

Take Away of Question 10



Overall Very Positive Reception:

- Many participants described the event as perfect, wonderful, and insightful.
- o The interactive nature and well-chosen venue received specific praise.

2. Suggestions for Better Amenities:

- Several attendees requested better provision of water and coffee during sessions.
- Providing drinks directly in the conference room was a repeated suggestion.

3. Need for More Networking Opportunities:

- Participants expressed a desire for more time dedicated to networking.
- Suggestions included more frequent and longer breaks to facilitate discussions.

4. Adjustments to Session Structure:

- Attendees suggested fewer topics and presentations to allow more time for in-depth discussion.
- More focused sessions with additional time for Q&A and panel discussions were recommended.

5. Diverse Speaker and Content Preferences:

- There was feedback to include fewer speakers from consulting companies and more from various industries.
- Some participants suggested deeper dives into specific topics like ESG, reporting tools, and compliance functions.

6. Future Sessions and Follow-ups:

- Several comments highlighted the need for follow-up sessions and more frequent events.
- Bringing experts together for "share & learn" sessions and more panel discussions with practical examples were highly requested.

Next Steps / Recommendation



- Digest evaluation results
- Align on Executive Summary and Take Aways per question
- Take evaluation outcome as critical source to organize ESG conferences in the next 12 to 18 months

- Recommendation
 - Under the direction of ETHICS conduct a follow-up activities within 6 to 7 months from now – e.g. HETHICO 2024, ETHICS 2024 Annual Summit
